Our **Programs**

Livengrin Foundation, Inc. was incorporated in 1966 as a 501(c)(3). We are currently one of the oldest, independent, non-profit, addiction treatment providers in the tri-state area, serving adults with primary substance use disorders.

Sub-Acute Detox

Withdrawal symptoms are medically managed to achieve stabilization.

Problem Gambling

Prevention, early intervention, and treatment of problem gambling for individuals and families.

Residential

Strengths-based approach to treatment using evidence-based practices.

Family Education

Family members are encouraged to be involved in the treatment process through education, family sessions and community support.

Outpatient

Recommended upon completion of residential treatment or personally or professionally require an outpatient setting.

Veterans/First Responders

Full continuum of treatment, gambling, trauma and PTSD delivered by peer Veteran & First Responders.

Meet Alex

I came to Livengrin in October of 2017. I was so scared. I didn't know what to expect coming into treatment at a new facility for the first time. When I arrived to be admitted I was greeted by staff that wanted to help me get my life back. The whole process was really relaxed and made me feel safe, even though it was literally the most emotional day of my life up until that point. After I said my goodbyes to my family, I made my way through the rest of the admissions process. I met with the nursing staff, some of which still work here at Livengrin. The next few days were rough for me. I was detoxing from a long list of substances. I can remember I was a shivering, sweating mess. After about five days the worst was over. I was ready to move over to rehab. Again, I didn't know what to expect, but Mark and Harold were there to make me feel comfortable. I was assigned a counselor. I met with her to discuss what I wanted to get out of treatment and came up with a treatment plan. I made my way into the community. I met some cool people while here at Livengrin, some of which I am still friends with to this day. Every day was different while in treatment. We started the day with a morning community meeting, where there was music and laughing. We said goodbye to graduates of the program. I thought that was cool that the community rallied around that person to wish them luck and to give them their best advice. After that there were a ton of different things on the agenda. Lectures, group therapy, 12-step meetings, just to name a few. I worked on a lot of issues here at Livengrin. My counselor and I took a deep look into why I drank and used drugs. We even got my family involved which was an extremely important part of my recovery. Livengrin hosts a parent and family group which my family attended weekly. My mom even got plugged into Nar-Anon and started her recovery journey as well. Today, I am the general manager for recovery houses to help others like me. In March of 2020 I lost my job while COVID-19 was starting to take off. An employee at Livengrin reached out to me to let me know that Livengrin was hiring. I was so excited to have the opportunity to work for the company that saved my life. I am so grateful to have the opportunity to be a part of something that saved my life and my family. I am beyond blessed.




